Monday- Dignity in the Developing World

Plan a discussion or a night of education focusing on the United Nation's Millennium Development Goals. Information put out by the NCSC can be found on our website, and also look for a guide of questions and answers.

Tuesday- Dignity of the Human Person

Prepare a rosary for your campus ministry in recognition of the dignity of the human person. Make sure to include prayer intentions for the sick, the suffering, and the unborn.

Wednesday- Dignity of the Homeless

Get a group of students together to go volunteer at a soup kitchen and take some time to talk to the people you meet. You could also prepare hygiene kits to take a local homeless shelter.

Thursday- Dignity of All Ages

Host a prayer service for your parish that focuses on all stages of life. Highlight the unborn, the youth, the elderly, and those who have already passed away, and include the chance for prayer intentions. Check out the provided prayer service on our website.

Friday- Dignity of All Cultures

Host a multicultural potluck for your campus ministry. Have students bring dishes from their families' heritage and include a recipe to share. This is an excellent chance for college students to share food and fellowship.
